Description

Kentuckiana Metroversity, Inc. is a consortium of eight institutions of higher education in the Louisville metropolitan area. Member institutions include: Bellarmine University, Indiana University Southeast, Ivy Tech Community College Southern Indiana, Jefferson Community College, Louisville Presbyterian Theological Seminary, Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, Spalding University, and University of Louisville.

LPTS students may take courses at Metroversity institutions pending approval of courses by appropriate Seminary personnel. Full-time students in good standing who have earned a minimum of twelve credit hours and have a 3.0 GPA are eligible.

Metroversity registration is limited to fall and spring term courses.

Financial Details

LPTS students are charged LPTS tuition for Metroversity courses, and Tuition Scholarships and Presidential Scholarships are applied towards these tuition costs. Students must pay out of pocket for any additional, non-tuition costs associated with Metroversity courses including fees for online courses.

Overseas Ministries Study Center at Princeton Theological Seminary

Description

The mission of the Overseas Ministries Study Center (OMSC) has been to strengthen the Christian world mission by providing: 1) residential programs for the renewal of missionaries and international church leaders; 2) research, publications, and scholarly forums for the advancement of mission scholarship; and 3) continuing education in cross-cultural Christian ministries. LPTS students have typically participated in OMSC seminars offered during the LPTS J-Term – traveling to New Haven, CT to do so.

Beginning in the 2020-2021 academic year, OMSC operations and programs relocated to Princeton, NJ in an agreement with Princeton Theological Seminary.

Financial Details

In the past, the Furlough Home Board has offered two \$600 scholarships to assist with the cost of travel and living expenses for the J-Term seminars. LPTS financial support could be applied to tuition costs associated with pursuing OMSC programs for academic credit (normally 1 credit hour for a J-term seminar).
